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Information about the device

Device description

The videoscope serves for inspecting concealed machine components or poorly or inaccessible hollows.

The device has the following features:

- high-resolution camera,
- operator software for control of functions,
- moveable camera head with adjustable, bright LED illumination,
- recording of pictures and videos, storage on an SD card,
- USB interface for data transmission

Safety

- · Protect the device from permanent direct sunlight.
- Do not remove any safety signs, stickers or labels from the device. Keep all safety signs, stickers and labels in legible condition.
- Do not open the device with a tool.
- Observe the storage and operating conditions (see chapter Technical data).

Intended use

Only use the device for the visualization of objects. To use the device for its intended use, only use accessories and spare parts which have been approved by Trotec.

Improper use

Do not use the device in potentially explosive areas. Never use the device on persons or animals. Trotec accepts no liability for damages resulting from improper use. In such a case, entitlements to a warranty are forfeited. Any unauthorised modifications, alterations or structural changes to the device are forbidden.

Residual risks

To prevent damages to the device, do not expose it to extreme temperatures or extreme humidity.

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Caution!

To prevent water damages to the device, please observe the different types of protection of the housing and the gooseneck probe.

The housing is splash-proof (IP54), the gooseneck probe can be immersed in water (IP67, 1 m / 30 min).



Caution!

Using the device continuously over several hours causes an increased heat generation in the LEDs in the probe tip. To increase the lifetime of both the LEDs and the imaging sensor we recommend allowing the device to cool down at ambient temperatures for at least 10 to 15 minutes with the power switched off after a long period of use.



Caution!

Do not use abrasive cleaners or solvents to clean the device.

Transport and storage

Transport

Use the supplied case to transport the device.



Storage

When the device is not being used, observe the following storage conditions:

- dry,
- protected from dust and direct sunlight,
- with a plastic cover to protect it from invasive dust, if necessary.
- The storage temperature is the same as the range given in the chapter Technical data.
- When storing the device for a long time, remove the batteries.
- Preferably use the supplied case to store the device.

Operation

Inserting the batteries



Make certain that the surface of the device is dry and the device is switched off.



- 1. Remove the cover from the battery compartment by sliding it in the direction of the arrow.
 - The cover is firmly attached to the battery compartment.
- 2. Take out the battery holder.
 - Remove any used batteries.
- 3. Insert the batteries in the battery holder with correct polarity.
- 4. Insert the battery holder in the battery compartment by sliding it in the direction of the arrow.
- 5. Reattach the cover to the battery compartment.

Note:

Alternatively, the device can be operated with the power adapter connected. For this purpose, connect the supplied power adapter with the connection (17).



Caution!

Only use the supplied power adapter or a power adapter with identical specifications! An unsuitable power adapter can cause damage to the device!

Inserting an SD card

- 1. Open the rubber tab on the left side of the device.
- 2. Insert the SD card in the SD card slot (19).
- 3. Slightly press down the SD card until it engages.
- 4. Close the rubber tab.

Switching on and off

- Briefly press the Power button (14).
 - The display is switched on.
 - The device is ready for operation.
- Press the Power button (14) for approx. 3 seconds.
 - The device switches off.



Aligning/moving/holding the camera

Note:

Please note that the surface of the netting at the probe exterior may fray over time depending on the mechanical stress (e. g. when in contact with sharp-edged objects). This does not constitute a defect of the device but normal wear and tear, which cannot be avoided.

- 1. Use the cursor (9) to move the camera (3) in the desired direction.
- 2. Slide the key lock (10) to locked.
 - The joystick (9) is locked.
 - The camera head is fixed in its position.

Caution!

Avoid pulling on the probe cable while the key lock in enabled; the camera head and the cable may get damaged!

The camera head is held in position by the key lock and can thus inadvertently become a barbed hook.

Taking a picture

- 1. Press the Up/Down button (13) to switch into photo mode.
 - A camera symbol is displayed in the top left corner while in photo mode (20).
- 2. Press the Photo/OK button (15).
 - The picture is taken.

Recording a video

- 1. Press the Up/Down button (13) to switch into video mode.
 - A video symbol is displayed in the top left corner while in video mode (20).
- 2. Press the Video button (7).
 - The videoscope switches to recording mode.
 - The recording is started.
- 3. Press the Video button (7).
 - The recording is stopped.

Viewing recordings

- 1. Press the Play button (6).
 - The videoscope switches to picture view.
- 2. Press the Up/Down button (13).
 - The different recordings will be displayed on the screen.
 - Press the Zoom button (8) to see a preview of up to six pictures/videos.
 - Press the Zoom button (8) again to exit the preview mode.
- 3. Press the Play button (6) again to play a video or, if necessary, to pause.
- 4. Press the Video button (7).
 - The picture view is stopped.
 - The videoscope switches back to recoding mode.

Deleting pictures or videos

- 1. Press the Play button (6).
 - The videoscope switches to picture view.
- 2. Press the Up/Down button (13) or the brightness button (11) until the desired recording is displayed.
- 3. Press the Menu button (12).
 - The submenu *Delete* will be displayed.



4. Select the desired setting.

- 5. Press the Photo/OK button (15).
 - The submenu *Delete File* will be displayed.



- 6. Confirm the selection by pressing the Photo/OK button (15).
 - The selected action is executed.
 - The videoscope switches to picture view.

Operator software

Setting the resolution

- 1. Press the Menu button (12).
 - The selection menu will be displayed.



- 2. Select the menu item *Resolution* by use of the Up/Down button (13).
- 3. Confirm the selection by pressing the Photo/OK button (15).
 - The submenu *Resolution* will be displayed.



4. Use the Up/Down button (13) to select the desired resolution.

D1	normal resolution

5. Confirm the selection by pressing the Photo/OK button (15).

Set date and time

- 1. Press the Menu button (12).
 - The selection menu will be displayed.



- 2. Select the menu item *Set Date/Time* by use of the Up/Down button (13).
- 3. Photo/OK button (15).
 - The submenu Set Date/Time will be displayed.
 - The date is indicated in year/month/day format.



- 4. Use the Up/Down button (13) or the Brightness button (11) to select the desired year.
- 5. Press the Zoom button (8).
 - The field for the month is now enabled.
- The settings are made as described for the year.
- 6. Repeat steps 4. and 5. until time and date are set.
- 7. Press the Photo/OK button (15).
 - The settings will be saved.

Setting the time stamp

- 1. Press the Menu button (12).
 - The selection menu will be displayed.



- 2. Select the menu item *Time Stamp* by use of the Up/Down button (13).
- Confirm the selection by pressing the Photo/OK button (15).
 The submenu *Time Stamp* will be displayed.



4. Use the Up/Down button (13) to select the desired setting.

5. Confirm the selection by pressing the Photo/OK button (15).
The time stamp will be set and the selection menu will be displayed.

Formatting an SD card

- 1. Press the Menu button (12).
 - The selection menu will be displayed.



- 2. Select the menu item *Format* by use of the Up/Down button (13).
- 3. Confirm the selection by pressing the Photo/OK button (15).





4. Use the Up/Down button (13) to select the desired setting.

- 5. Confirm the selection by pressing the Photo/OK button (15).
 - The process will be executed and the selection menu will be displayed.

Set language

- 1. Press the Menu button (12).
 - The selection menu will be displayed.



- 2. Select the menu item *Language* by use of the Up/Down button (13).
- Confirm the selection by pressing the Photo/OK button (15).
 The submenu Language will be displayed.



- 4. Use the Up/Down button (13) to select the desired language.
- 5. Confirm the selection by pressing the Photo/OK button (15).
 - The desired language will be set and the selection menu will be displayed.

Maintenance and repair

Charging the battery

Charge the battery when the battery status indication (21) flashes red. Only use the supplied power adapter or a power adapter with identical specifications for charging the batteries!

Note:

You can supply the device with electricity via the power adapter. To do so, connect the cable of the supplied power adapter to the corresponding connection (17).

Caution!

Only use the supplied power adapter or a power adapter with identical specifications! An unsuitable power adapter can cause damage to the device!

Alternatively, you can use spare batteries (type see Technical data).

Cleaning

Clean the device with a soft, damp and lint-free cloth. Ensure that no moisture enters the housing. Do not use any sprays, solvents, alcohol-based cleaning agents or abrasive cleaners. Only use clean water to moisten the cloth.

Repair

Do not modify the device or install any spare parts. For repairs or device testing, contact the manufacturer.

Disposal
